

President's Message

Hooray, it's pool season!

POOL HOURS & ACTIVITIES: The school year is coming to an end and we are gearing up for extended pool hours. Beginning June 2, the pool will be open every day! On June 14, we move to full summer hours (see specific hours in the sidebar). From now through June 13, the Sea Otters have lanes 1-4 M-F from 3:30-7:30 PM. Lane 5 and the diving well are open for families during those times.

MOVIE NIGHTS: We hope you were able to join us last month where we played Star Wars. June's Movie Night is Friday, 6/9 at 8:00pm. By popular demand, we'll be showing Star Wars - Empire Strikes Back.

LATE NIGHT SWIM: Our first late night swim will be Saturday, June 10, and we'll be open until 10PM. We will be featuring a live band known as Afterglow and will have games and prizes!

LAP SWIM: Starting June 14, morning lap swim hours change to M-F 5-7AM. We are also offering Lane 1 in the main pool, for lap swim, M-TH from 12:00-1:00PM. Please keep in mind, the club will be open and the main pool will be in use for open swim starting at 12:30 PM. Also note, there will be school pool parties on June 8, 9 and 13, so there also will be no 9-11 AM lap swim those days.

ACTIVITIES SURVEY: Thank you to all who responded to our Activities Survey in April. We've completed, or are working to implement some of the activities/requests that had overwhelming support. Please be reminded that Activities at the club need a Lead or Sponsor, so please reach out if you're interested in coordinating an Activity (such as, table tennis tournament or Bingo). In the meantime:

- The game room has been updated.
- We are installing 11' cantilever umbrellas around the pool deck for more shade.
- We plan to update the volleyball court with a new net and sand, later this year.

- In the Fall/Winter, we hope to offer Bingo, Oktoberfest, Halloween Scavenger/Candy Hunt, Parent's Night Out (holiday shopping) and a New Year's Eve Party.

be current in order to use the club facilities. If we have your email address on file, you can get email reminders for dues, as well as pay online.




Free Weekly Activities

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Neighborhood Happenings

THE FARMER'S MARKET IS BACK!

Santa Teresa Farmer's Market is open again, every Saturday from 9AM-1PM at 6232 Santa Teresa Blvd (Kaiser/Library parking lot). Shop a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables, as well as other stands such as baked goods, eggs, honey, and more!

TINY HOMES PROTEST

Join concerned citizens on Saturday, June 3, to protest against bringing Homeless Tiny Homes to the neighborhood. Protesters will convene from 11 AM until 12 Noon at the Cottle VTA Station. Event organizers hope to encourage the VTA Board to reject the City of San Jose proposal to designate the station as a Tiny Homes site, and to keep the parking lot for VTA riders.

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MAKE SURE TO RE-COVER THE SPA AFTER USE

Members must put the cover back on the spa if used when the main pool is not open. This helps maintain the water temperature and decrease our heating costs.

SECOND QUARTER DUES ARE NOW PAST DUE

Second Quarter 2023 dues were due April 1. THIS IS YOUR DUES NOTICE. We do not mail invoices to save costs. If we have your email on file, reminders will be sent along with the ability to pay your dues online. **Dues are now \$120/quarterly or \$480/annually.** A \$10 late fee is assessed after the 15th day of the Quarter.

Payment options:

- Check/cash: Mail to RSTSRC, 286 Sorrento Way, San Jose, CA 95119. You can also drop it off at the club mailbox located on the top of the stairs by the front Hall entrance.
- EFT: If you have not received an online invoice, send your email to RSTSRCoffice@gmail.com. You will receive invoice emails that will allow you to pay online. There is no additional fee to you.
- CREDIT/DEBIT: A nominal fee of \$4/qtr, \$12/year is required. Email the office and request credit/debit payment.

The Real Estate Report

Sales Prices & Sales Continue to Fall

The median sales price for single-family, resale homes rose, month-over-month. It was up 5.9% from March. It was down 8.2% compared to last year.

The average sales price for single-family, resale homes was up 3.3%, month-overmonth. It was down 8.9% year-over-year.

Sales of single-family, re-sale homes were down for the twentieth month in a row, year-over-year, in April. Sales fell 45.4%. There were 526 homes sold in Santa Clara County last month. The monthly average since 2000 is 987.

The sales price to list price ratio rose from 102.9% to 104.8%.

Pending sales were down 10.1% year-overyear.

After being up, year-over-year, thirteen months in a row, inventory of single-family, re-sale homes was down 22.8% compared to last year. As of May 5th, there were 644 homes for sale in Santa Clara County. The average since January 2000 is 2,703.

Days of Inventory, or how long it would take to sell all homes listed for sale at the current rate of sales, rose from 31 days to 36 days. The average since 2003 is 89.

It took nineteen days to sell a home last month. That is the time from when a home is listed for sale to when it goes into contract.

The median sales price for condos was down 12.1% compared to last April. The average sales price fell 8% year-over-year.

Condo sales were down 56.8% year-overyear. There were 218 condos sold in April.

The sales price to list price ratio rose from 101.5% to 103.2%.

Condo inventory was down 35.9% compared to last April.

As of May 5th, there were 227 condos for sale in Santa Clara County. The average since January 2000 is 757.

Days of inventory stayed at thirty.

It took an average of nineteen days to sell a condo last month.



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


